Kris Eglin: Area 1

Financial Aid for Offenders: Eligible or Not?

Individuals with criminal history can still be eligible for financial aid to complete their higher education. Upon release, most eligibility limitations will be removed. In addition, individuals may apply for aid in anticipation of being released so that the aid can be processed in time. The only two limitations to eligibility that remain after release are: 1) if an individual was convicted for the possession or sale of illegal drugs while receiving federal student aid (however eligibility can be re-established) and 2) if an individual was convicted a forcible or non-forcible sexual offense and is subject to an involuntary civil commitment upon completion of a period of incarceration for that offense.
